We look forward to members and non members marching to keep up the past traditions of the Royal Australian Survey Corps on this Special Day of Remembrance.

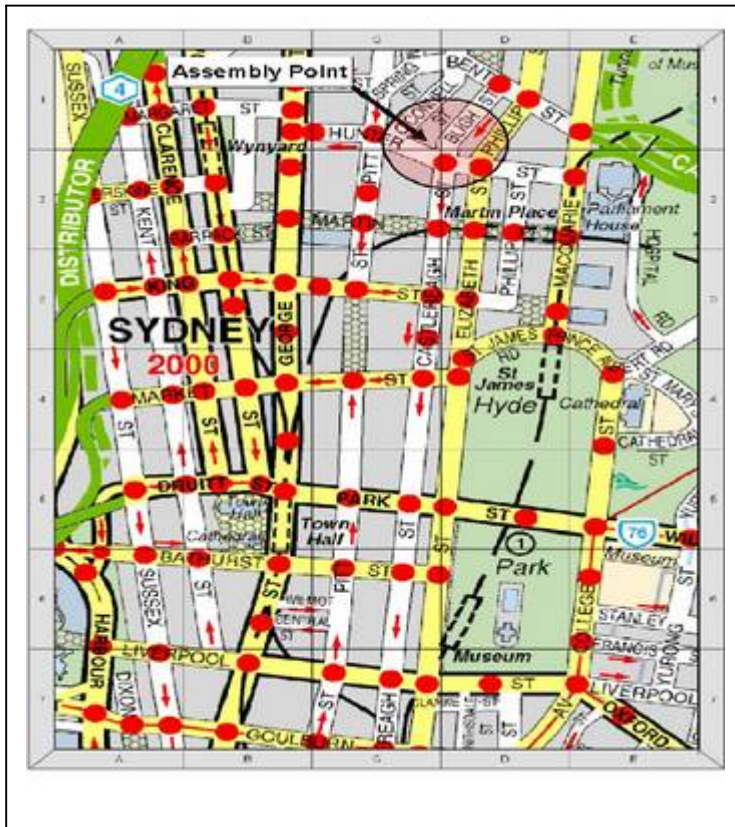
As in past years members from the Geomatic Wing of SME have volunteered to carry the banner. For those who have purchased the Corps purple beret & badges please remember to wear them on the day.

The Royal Australian Engineers celebrated 150 years of service in 2010.

As part of the celebrations the AAMME commissioned an exhibition at the Museum of Military Engineering to commemorate the early formation of the Corps.

The exhibition was officially opened on the 13<sup>th</sup> November 2010 and finishes at the end of March 2011.

Past and present members of AAMME and the general public were invited to the official opening to view displays of equipment used by the engineers over the past 150 years.
